



Next Steps...

- Research the organization
- Identify a contact person at the organization
- Send an introduction email
 - Your name and position
 - Description of your organization with the website link
 - ▶ BE CONCISE!
 - Include that you'd like to explore how your organizations may be able to work together
 - Ask for a face-to-face meeting, when possible
- Make cold calls

At the meeting...

- Send in your "I" person to the initial meeting
- Everyone should introduce themselves and their organizations and programs
- Share data and impact stories
- Listen for opportunities for collaboration
- If there is a synergy, agree to take meeting notes back to the team for discussion of next steps
- In a TIMELY manner, reconnect with your new contact to set a follow up meeting with the both teams
 - collaborate on how both organizations can work together...what does it look like?
 - add value to each other's programs
- Don't for get the MOU? (Memorandum of Understanding)



Best Practices...

- Connect and explore your network
- Explore community collaboratives, workforce development organizations, and colleges and universities
- Identify the "I" teammate to create and build community relationships
- Send a warm introductory email or phone call
- ▶ Request a meeting, face to face if possible
- At the meeting...
 - ▶ Everyone should introduce themselves and their respective programs
 - Share organizational data and impact stories
 - Determine if there is a synergy
 - Discuss next steps
 - Must be a mutual value added
 - Formalize the partnership with an MOU
